Sales Tax Measure Update

The Sacramento Transportation Authority (STA) Board is wrapping up its work on the Tax Expenditure Plan, which is the basis for a sales tax measure that will be put before voters in the fall. The SacMoves/SMART coalition has been successful in helping to draft language that puts people over cars through Complete Streets policies and other bike and pedestrian improvements. *But the work isn't over and we need you to bring your voice to the next STA Board meeting:*

There's an App for That: *311 Sacramento and OurStreets*

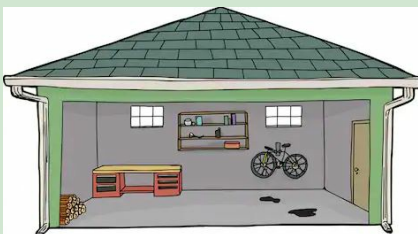
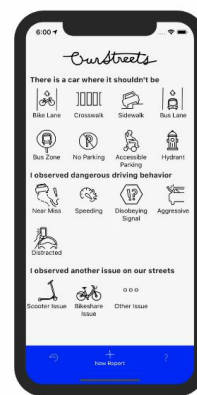


Did you know that the City of Sacramento has a phone app that you can use to report potholes, leaf/trash piles in the bike lanes and other challenges that you may face while traveling around town by bicycle? *Sacramento City 311* handles all City municipal service requests that are not police- and fire-related. This free phone app allows you to make service requests 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including holidays. The City says they are committed to customer service and look forward to hearing from you, so let them hear from you!



The other day on my ride home, I was stopped three times by delivery vans parked in the bike lane delivering packages. You know who I'm

talking about – slate blue vans with an arrow that looks like a smile painted on the side. Now there's a way to capture these challenges. ***OurStreets*** is a mobile app that uses crowdsourcing to report dangerous driving behavior and shared micromobility issues. The company will work directly with advocacy organizations like SABA – municipal stakeholders and transportation departments and shared micromobility operators – to amplify challenges faced by people who travel our streets by bike, scooter, or walking. It's user friendly and serves to highlight issues of road usage. Give it a try and let us know what you think.
