SACOG is currently working on the Sacramento Region Parks & Trails Strategic Development Plan to envision a system of connected trails and parks across El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba counties.

The plan will recognize projects in the near future to jumpstart a connected trail network with a focus on creating access to low-income communities that are currently lacking access to green spaces and safe ways to move around without a car. The hope is to create a unified vision for a regional trails system and prioritize future investments.

Slow and Active Streets (SaS) Update

Midtown is changing it up! Currently, 26th street (between J & V) and O street (between 22nd & 26th) are designated as Slow and Active streets. Newly proposed is 22nd between K & Q). **The City is considering shutting down this entire section of SaS.** Please add your voice and lend your support of this addition by responding to this survey and letting the City know that you support SaS in Midtown.



Cabrillo Park SaS are launching now! After engagement with the residents in the neighboring areas, the City is implementing SaS on Tamoshanter Way (between 62nd & Kirk Way) and 68th (between Amherst & Balfour Way). SwEeT!

Oak Park & Tahoe Park Slow and Active Streets are in the pipeline. Look for a survey soon to show your support of these pilot road changes.
