Active Transportation Commission: Improving Walking and Biking in Sacramento

At SABA, we strive every day to make our region a safer, better place through biking. The City's Active Transportation Commission (ATC) also works to make Sacramento a city that is accessible to pedestrians and cyclists.

Recently, the ATC submitted a report to the Personnel and

Public Employees committee, which will then go on to the entire City Council. This report outlined nine ways our city can become more walkable and bikeable. They are:

- 1. Increase funding to active transportation
- 2. Expand speed management programs
- 3. Develop a city wide Safe Routes to School program
- 4. Finalize construction detour policy
- 5. Develop an ATC dashboard
- 6. Create a quick-build bikeways program
- 7. Pilot an electric bike library and promote e-bike incentives
- 8. Increase bike parking
- 9. Re-Establish Slow and Active streets

Help Pass A.B. 413

Let's talk about daylighting. It's the concept behind A.B. 413. What is it? Why does it matter and why should you support it?

As described by Streetopia, daylighting "is a simple pedestrian safety measure achieved by removing curb parking

spaces around an intersection, increasing visibility for pedestrians and drivers and minimizing conflicts."

It isn't just beneficial for pedestrians, it also protects cyclists. Often protected bike lanes can obscure cyclists from cars and vice versa. By removing parking spots at least 20 feet from the crosswalk, both drivers and cyclists can see each other before reaching the intersection. This allows for better visual communication between those who are sharing the road.
