City Council Meeting on CAAP

Tuesday, August 22, 2023,

Sacramento City Council will have a meeting to discuss the Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP) as part of the General plan for 2040. The SABA Board along with Deb Banks, SABA's ED have outlined recommendations that have the potential to impact climate change through the use of bikes and infrastructure. The following recommendations are:

- 1. Strategies for speed reduction, and road design that comply with Vision Zero, and Complete Streets requirements.
- 2. Additional tree canopies to reduce urban heat islands.
- 3. Creation of Low/Zero Emissions Zones
- 4. Eliminate Parking and parking subsidies downtown.
- 5. Create Incentives to encourage individuals to buy e-bikes and businesses to buy e-cargo bikes.
- 6. Prioritize mode shift targets to encourage citizens to use bikes more often

If you're interested in advocating on behalf of biking and infrastructure, we encourage you to attend this city council meeting either in person or via Zoom. We encourage you to speak up and push what you believe our council should prioritize in a rehearsed two-minute statement. If you agree with our recommendations, please feel free to include them in your comments. Council meetings start at 5:00PM. Info about Council agendas can be found here.
