Best & Worst Bicycle Infrastructure in the Sac Region

We asked and you told us!

Hands down the winner is the American River Bike Trail. Why? It's comfortable, easy to use and away from all vehicles! One respondent wrote, "Riding through nature isn't just safer and quieter, it's restorative to the soul." We couldn't agree more.

We didn't reach consensus on the worst infrastructure voted by respondents, but accessing colleges rose to the top. A couple of people pointed to the connection between 62nd & Elvas, and the vaunted "Hornet Crossing" to CSUS. There are high speed motorists in both directions, crossing Elvas is required, one or more of illegal (e.g. riding wrong-way, illegal u-turn) or dangerous (extended riding in middle/suicide lane) maneuvers are required to reach Hornet Crossing.

The other is 24th Street south of Sac City College, the southern access to the college and a light rail stop. There are no bike lanes and where there are sidewalks, they are obstructed by utility poles. Cyclists ride in four wide, straight lanes that encourage people to put the pedal to the metal.

Given that both of these examples are for young people who are in college, we clearly have some work to do. Cyclists shouldn't have to feel like their life is in jeopardy while trying to get to the places important in their lives.

SABA is cooking up goodness in Oak Park!

We have exciting news to share: Assemblymember Kevin McCarty has secured \$300,000 in the 2023–2024 state budget for us for e-bike lending libraries in two locations. One of those is in partnership with the <u>Alchemist CDC</u>, and we'll be located in the Oak Park Art Garden (OPAG).

We'll be working to create a space that includes a tool lending library as well as our e-bike lending library, both of which will be a great service to the local community. We envision the future Art Garden to have both libraries open each week, plus we'll provide free bike repair, bike maintenance sessions and other community events. We are grateful for the partnership and support and can't wait to see this idea become a bustling space in Oak Park.

Winter Wheelers Recap

Thank you everyone who participated in the Winter Wheelers campaign during December.

7,188 trips were logged.
103,829 miles were ridden.
Not quite 10% of those rides were for



transportation.

We saved over **75,000** lbs of CO2, which is the equivalent of planting **136** trees and taking two cars off the road for a year.

Congratulations to our Festivus winners!

During our 7-day challenge from Christmas to the New Year, 1,716 trips were logged. 32,000 miles were ridden and over 1,000 lbs of CO2 was saved. In that one week alone, our efforts benefited the region as much as planting 19 trees would have done. Woohoo!
