



Legislative Wins for Active Transportation in 2023

Here's a rundown on the legislative wins for active transportation in 2023. For more info on all of these and what's taking shape for 2024, head <u>here</u>.

AB 143: Signed into law, this new statewide standard requires a 20 ft setback for

car parking on all unmarked and marked crosswalks.

SB 695: Recent issues surface the fact that Caltrans needs more oversight. This law requires Caltrans to release all data on projects to a public portal and present results at commission meetings.

AB 251: This law will require a study of the oversized SUVs and light trucks with the rise in pedestrian fatalities to determine if the state should levy additional fees on larger vehicles for their wear and tear on transportation infrastructure.

AB 645: This law will allow six cities to start a pilot program that uses cameras to issue speeding tickets. Cameras help remove racial bias in speed enforcement.

AB 361: This law makes it illegal for cars to park in the bike lane.

SB 712: This law prevents landlords from stopping tenants from storing personal micromobility devices in their dwelling units. Landlords must provide storage space if they don't want devices kept in the units.



Sacramento 2040 General Plan Update

The Planning and Design Commission will vote on whether or not to approve Sacramento's General Plan this Thursday, January 25th at 5:30pm. If the plan, which includes the Climate Action and Adaptation Plan, is approved by the commission it will be presented to city council on Feb 27, 2024. Don't want to wait in line? We offer VIP services to all sustaining members at the electric bike tier. Consider


