Bicycle Legislative Agenda for 2024

It's another busy legislative year for active transportation with 12 bills coming on the agenda. Of those 12 bills, CalBike has outlined four that they consider to be must-pass bills.

Two of these bills are sponsored by state Senator Scott Wiener. The first is



the Complete Streets bill which requires that safe infrastructure be implemented on local streets when being repaved on state routes. Originally vetoed by the governor in 2019, this new measure requires Caltrans to follow through with work plans. The Safe Vehicles Save Lives bill requires trucks to have side guards and cars built after 2017 to have speed limiters.

Another bill is the Quicker and Better Bike Lanes lane sponsored by State representative Laure Friedman. This bill would limit funding for sharrows and eliminate loopholes for creating complete streets that allow agencies to opt out if a parallel facility is nearby. Most importantly, this bill would require Caltrans to allow guick build techniques for active transportation structures that could be implemented in months, rather than years.

Assemblymember Mia Bonta's bill would limit freeway expansion for freight traffic. Numerous studies show that expanding freeways and adding lanes doesn't help with congestion or demand. Instead, it increases traffic and raises greenhouse gas emissions. Often, those most effected are people of color living in marginalized neighborhoods. Read up on these bills here.

Mobility Zones Project

The Mobility Zones Project

identifies areas with localized transportation challenges and works with communities to determine what solutions will improve safety and convenience, whether it's to the grocery store, or work, or taking a walk around the neighborhood.

Each Community Committee will have 6-8 people per county in the SACOG six-county region: Placer, El Dorado, Yolo, Sacramento, and Yuba-Sutter.

About the Project:

The Mobility Zones project will engage residents across the region to **co-create** clean, shared, and active transportation infrastructure projects, with the goal to **address barriers** to equitable mobility and **reduce carbon emissions** in locally designated "Mobility Zones" within the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) six-county region (El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, Yolo, Yuba, and Sutter Counties).

The Why

Our transportation system was not built to protect its most vulnerable users.

- Children living within a few minutes of their school cannot safely walk or bike.
- Communities in rural regions are severely impacted by extreme weather events such as floods, heatwaves, and wildfires caused by climate change, and they lack access to transportation that supports carbon reduction.
- Black residents of the region face a higher risk of injury or death than white residents when walking from place to place.

Program Elements

What are mobility zones?

Mobility zones are neighborhood-scale areas identified as needing enhanced mobility and connectivity. These areas may not have received much investment in the past.

Why do we need mobility zones?

Defining Mobility Zones help us prioritize locally-specific strategies to meet the needs we hear from residents living in the zones. The community must be involved in envisioning how equitable transportation looks. Having a bucket (the "Zone") within which to develop projects helps us prioritize the projects based on community values. Ultimately, the Mobility Zones project intends to make it easier to pursue funding and implement projects to help people get where they need to go.


