SABA Wins Grant from Impact100 for Positive Spin Bicycle Collective

On October 17, local philanthropy group Impact100 Sacramento awarded SABA a \$25,000 grant to create Positive Spin, a youth-led community bike shop that will teach young people bicycle mechanics and repair, and business skills. SABA raised money for the project from its Velo Ball event and, with the grant from Impact100 is closer to its \$100,000 goal.

SABA is partnering with Community Shop Class (CSC) and Sierra Service Project (SSP) to run the classes which are geared towards neurodivergent youth as well as other young people in the neighborhood. The students will learn workforce

skills that build sustainable transportation and support others. Help us <u>reach our goal</u> for this valuable project.

Road Safety Recommendations finalized by ATC

The Sacramento Active Transportation Commission finalized the annual recommendations and corresponding report on October 17. The recommendations, which focused on harm reduction and the need to save lives on Sacramento streets, will be submitted to the City Council with hope of securing adoption in 2025. Cycling in the News

- <u>Bike-Friendly Wins and Losses (but Mostly Wins) in 2024</u>, CalBike, October 7, 2024: Nine of the bills CalBike supported made it to the governor's desk he signed seven and vetoed two. Another eight bills CalBike supported died in the legislature. In addition, two e-bike pilot measures we were watching became law, and one e-bike restriction died in the legislature.
- Road deaths rival the number of homicides as Sacramento considers state of
 emergency, Sacramento Bee, October 18, 2024: The number of traffic deaths on
 city streets has been close to the number of homicides in Sacramento for a
 decade, according to a new report for the City Council that will soon consider a
 proposed emergency declaration on cyclist and pedestrian safety.
- <u>Caltrans to award \$206 million for 149 transportation projects to reduce pollution</u>, *Mass Transit*, October 9, 2024: The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will award \$206 million for 149 local, clean transportation projects to reduce pollution, especially in disadvantaged communities across the state.
- <u>Highway Robbery</u>, *Dissent*, October 10, 2024: Government highway agencies have enabled the blatant falsification of traffic model results. As a result, the United States wastes billions on road expansions that fail to cure congestion and make it harder to get around without a car.
