## World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims

On <u>World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims</u> – November 17 – U.S. communities will join in solidarity and urge action to address the nation's preventable roadway safety crisis. Crash survivors, grieving families, advocates and public agency representatives are remembering those killed and injured, and urging specific, life–saving changes at local, state and federal levels.



As Ariane Lange <u>reports in the Sacramento Bee</u>, 31 people died in traffic collisions on city streets this year. Nineteen were pedestrians or cyclists: Mattie Nicholson, 56; Kate Johnston, 55; Jeffrey Blain, 59; Aaron Ward, 40; Sam Dent, 41; Terry Lane, 55; David Rink, 51; James Lind, 54; Tyler Vandehei, 32; Jose Valladolid Ramirez, 36; Larry Winters, 76; Sau Voong, 84; Johnnie A. Fite, 82; Robert Kohler Jr., 50; Edward Lopez, 61; Muhammad Saddique, 64; Azure Amonti Daniels, 48; Jordan Nicolas Rodriguez, 38; and Nelson Lee, 64, who died November 6. Two more people — Geohaira "Geo" Sosa, 32, and Kaylee Xiong, 18 — were killed while riding electric scooters.

## **Take Action for Road Safety**

- California Assembly Bill 413, also known as the Daylighting Law, went into effect January 1, 2023 but hasn't always been enforced. It requires leaving at least 20 feet (or one large car length) between a marked or unmarked crosswalk and your vehicle, so approaching vehicles can see pedestrians and bicycles. Contact your council person to encourage them to advocate for enforcement of this law.
- Help make cycling safer by downloading the <u>Bike Lane Uprising</u> app to report obstructions in bike lanes.
- Learn about how changes to city infrastructure can make cycling and walking safer – listen to a <u>report by ABC 10</u> including an interview with SABA Executive Director Deb Banks.
- Let your city council person know that you support theproposal to declare a <u>state of emergency to improve pedestrian and cyclist safetyin</u> Sacramento.
- Participate in <u>Sacramento's Streets for People Plan</u> by providing comments or attending a planning meeting.
