SABA Wins Grant for the Safe Routes to Schools Program

Safe Routes to School is a program dedicated to providing safer routes for students to walk and bike to school. When children walk or cycle to school, it improves their self-confidence and academic performance; they get more

physical exercise and have lower rates of obesity. In the long run, getting children and parents to rely on walking and cycling instead of cars leads to less traffic and improved air quality and creates healthier, more sustainable communities.



SABA received a grant from Sacramento County to conduct the safety program at local schools in the Bell Avenue and Elkhorn Blvd neighborhoods.
