

Advocacy Alert: Urge Newsom to Sign SB 720

SAFE

Serious Injuries & Fatalities in CA From Red Light & Intersection Violations 2021 to 2023



SABA and Streets Are For Everyone held a press conference at the Capitol on September 30 to urge Governor Newsome to sign SB 720, a bill that would install a more equitable and sustainable red light camera system at California intersections.

"In Sacramento County, red light running puts our most vulnerable road users at extreme risk every single day, said SABA Director Deb Banks.

"Look at these 195 empty chairs. Many represent people who were biking or walking who had no protection when someone ran a red light."

Red light camera systems have been used in the past, but SB 720 proposes a system that

addresses privacy concerns, is more manageable for law enforcement, easier to navigate for offenders, and more equitable for lower income people.

Advocacy Alert - I-80 Causeway Bike Path

The I-80 Causeway Bike Path is part of the main route cyclists use travelling between Davis and Sacramento. It is well-traveled, with over 200 cyclists (including approximately 100 students) using the path per day.



PG&E is going to be conducting a pipeline replacement project across Prospect Slough in West Sacramento. They are saying it will require the closure of the I–80 Causeway bike path for approximately four months total over two years when the work is started in 2027. This project is a horizontal drilling project to replace the pipeline under the Yolo Bypass.
