#### Newsom Signs Red Light Camera Bill



On October 13, Governor Newsom signed SB 720, an updated and improved red light camera bill that SABA strongly supported.

Thanks to everyone who advocated for Newsom to sign the bill which includes equity and privacy protections and is designed to be more efficient and less punitive.

It also designates any camera revenues to be used for safe streets projects.

# City Council Moves Forward with New Paved Trail on Sacramento River Parkway

On October 14, the Sacramento City Council voted to move forward with the Sacramento River Parkway paved trail from Garcia Bend to Zacharias Park on the river levee that runs through the Pocket and Greenhaven neighborhoods.

It's been 50 years since the proposed trail first went in front of council. The council unanimously



voted to adopt the addendum EIR and go forward with the design.

Over 100 comments in favor were filed, largely due to SABA's Action Alert and advocacy efforts about the need for a completed, comfortable network of trails.

This section of trail will bring us 4 miles closer to a completed Parkway. SABA's next advocacy effort on the trail is the Little Pocket section, which will complete the Parkway.

#### Honorary Sign Topper Approved for Helen "Maggie" O'Mara



Helen "Maggie" O'Mara was a long time active transportation advocate in Sacramento.

She passed away last year at the age of 71, and was honored on October 12 by Mayor Pro Tem Eric Guerra with a sign topper on 34th Street at Truckee Way and Northside Row in Sacramento.

On his Facebook page, Guerra noted that, "Maggie was a tireless champion for safer streets. As president of the Tahoe Park Neighborhood Association, she pushed for more bike racks, shaped the Active Streets Pilot Project, and played a key role in getting bike lanes installed on 34th Street under Highway 50. She later served on the

SABA Board and as Bicycle Safety Coordinator at Caltrans, leaving a lasting mark on Sacramento's bike safety."
