# Update on the California E-Bike Incentive Program



The California Air Resource Board (CARB) has informed SABA and other community-based organizations that they are ending the California E-Bike Incentive Project (EBIP) despite overwhelming demand. The EBIP offered California residents who met the project's income limits \$1750-\$2000 towards the purchase of a new Class 1, 2 or 3 e-bike, trike, or other adaptive cycle. CARB has decided to shutter the program and use the remaining funds for their Clean Cars 4 All program.

The EBIP was designed to provide California residents affordable and sustainable mobility without the ongoing financial burden of car ownership. Unlike electric vehicle incentives, which tie low-

income households to costly expenses like car payments, insurance, maintenance, and charging, the EBIP would have empowered people with a low cost, environmentally friendly transportation option and encourage a shift away from car dependent infrastructure at a fraction of the cost of an EV incentive.

SABA remains committed to promoting e-bikes as a more environmentally friendly means of transportation than electric cars. We have pilot projects in the works to bring an e-bike incentive program to Sacramento and are actively seeking partners to help make that a reality.
