Del Rio Trail Bridge Reopens

The Del Rio Trail Bridge, connecting South Sacramento with the Sacramento River Bike Trail leading to downtown Sacramento, originally opened in May 2024, but was closed after construction problems surfaced.

The bridge, which is open to cyclists and pedestrians, was rebuilt and reopened after months of delays on Tuesday, December 16. It is located above Riverside Boulevard, crosses Interstate 5 and is the final link in the 5 mile Del Rio paved trail between Meadowview and Land Park.

New Learn to Ride Classes Coming up in January



The next Learn 2 Ride classes are **Saturday, January 17 and 31, 2026 from 9 AM - 11 AM** (No classes in December).

Location: Miller Regional Park, 2701 Marina View Drive, Sacramento - in parking area to the north, closer to Broadway.

This class will focus on learning to ride a bike and is open to people of all ages (Level 1). If you already know how to ride but need a refresher on good cycling practices, this is also the class for you (Level 2).

League Cycling Instructors will assess your skill level and give coaching tips. If enough cyclists are ride-ready, there will be a short trail ride.
