Vision Zero Transportation Safety Initiative Announced at Press Conference



On November 26, the City of Sacramento announced its new initiative that would help fix unsafe infrastructure issues in a more timely manner.

So far in 2025, more than 100 traffic-safety improvements have been installed citywide that should lead to increased safety for cyclists and pedestrians, including 17 quick-build projects, 39 locations of intersection daylighting, 17 school-zone safety upgrades such as high-visibility crosswalks and enhanced signage, and six new stop-controlled residential intersections.

The press conference was held in Land Park at an intersection where a 12 year old cyclist had been

hit by a car and nearly killed in 2019.

The cyclist, Alena Wong, spoke at the conference. She is currently studying engineering at Cal Poly and hopes to use her education to help improve infrastructure to make cycling and walking safer.

Rankings of Bike Friendly Cities



Which global cities are truly investing in transforming their streets for cyclists? And which ones have fallen behind?

The answers are revealed in the 2025 edition of the Copenhagenize Index from Copenhagenize and EIT Urban Mobility. Out of 150 preselected cities, 100 cities from 44 countries were evaluated, making this ranking a one-of-a-kind global benchmark, featuring urban centers from every continent.

The top ranking went to Utrecht, Netherlands. Portland, OR received the top ranking in the United States.
