Sacramento Rolls Out a Quick-Build Project on Marysville Road

Local organizations, including SABA, worked hard to get the City of Sacramento to implement a "quick-build" program that would address problematic streets and intersections in the city that have a high number of crashes.



The city is beginning construction on a quick-build project on Marysville Blvd where several fatal crashes have occurred. The changes include reducing Marysville Boulevard from four lanes to two - this "road diet" has proven to slow traffic and reduce collisions. Buffered bike lanes and high-visibility crosswalks at Roanoke and Grand avenues will be added, as well as upgrades to traffic signals to make intersections safer for people walking and biking.

Safe Routes to Transit - Public Workshops

The [SacRT Safe Routes to Transit Plan](#) is a countywide planning effort funded by a Caltrans Sustainable Communities grant. As Sacramento County continues to see increased demand for safe and accessible walking and biking connections to transit, this

plan will identify key gaps and recommend improvements to ensure safer, more convenient access to SacRT bus stops and light rail stations.



SacRT is hosting a series of public workshops to gather community input on safety challenges, barriers, and opportunities for improving access to transit. These workshops are designed to be inclusive and accessible, with bilingual materials. If you can't make it in person, there is one virtual option available.

On the Federal Level, Safe Streets for Everyone Act Clears Subcommittee - How You Can Help Get it Passed

The Magnus White & Safe Streets For Everyone Act ([H.R. 7353](#)) was named for Magnus White who was a 17-year old competitive cyclist when he was killed by a car while biking home from training. After Magnus' tragic death, his parents became advocates for safe streets and created the [White Line Foundation](#).

The Act requires automatic emergency braking (AEB) systems on motorized vehicles that detect pedestrians, cyclists, and other vulnerable road users in both light and dark conditions. Its goal is to prevent injuries and deaths from crashes by strengthening vehicle safety standards.

The Act just cleared subcommittee and is heading to the House Energy & Commerce Committee.

The next classes for learning to ride a bicycle in 2026 are on the following Saturday mornings from 9 AM - 11 AM: **February 28, March 14, March 28, and April 11.**

This class will focus on learning to ride a bike and is open to people of all ages (Level 1). If you already know how to ride but need a refresher on good cycling practices, this is also the class for you (Level 2). League Cycling Instructors will assess your skill level and give coaching tips. If enough cyclists are ride-ready, there will be a short trail ride.
