On May 27, Julian Hernandez, SABA's Bike Lane Sweeper Project Manager, demonstrated the sweepers at a bike ride event to Bikedog Brewing East Sacramento where the voting took place for the sweeper names. "Munch" and "Crunch" were unanimously chosen.

The sweepers are pulled by an e-bike and clean most debris out of the bike lanes.

They will soon be available for use by community groups to sweep their neighborhoods.

Vision Zero Action Plan Update



The Draft Plan for the [Sacramento Vision Zero Action Plan Update](#) will be available for public review and comment from **June 15 to August 17** and they want your input!

In 2025, the City initiated an update to the Vision Zero Action Plan (VZAP), which outlines policy, program, and infrastructure strategies to reduce serious and fatal crashes.

In January-February 2026, the City conducted extensive community engagement and listening sessions. Based on what they heard about needs

and priorities, the City developed the Draft Vision Zero Action Plan. During the review time, Sacramento will host 5 community meetings, host the plan online for you to comment, and will be taking the plan on a roadshow to Sacramento's communities. [More information and how to participate.](#)

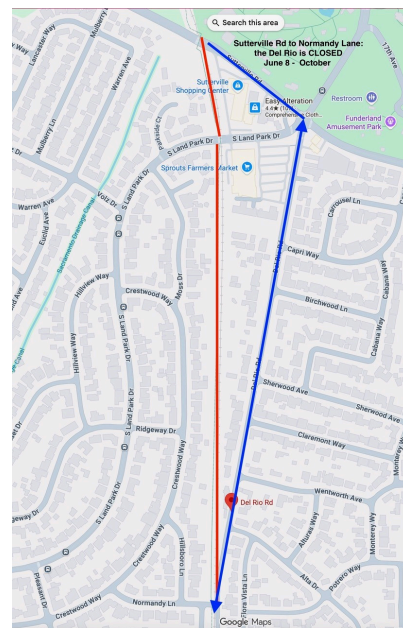
Del Rio Trail Closed for Sewer Repair

A portion of the Del Rio Trail will be closed to cyclists and pedestrians between Sutterville Road and South Land Park Drive.

Additional parts of the trail will be closed between South Land Park Drive and Del Rio Road/Normandy Lane beginning **June 8**, and both closures are scheduled through October 2026 as part of the City of Sacramento's **Del Rio Trail Sewer Rehabilitation Project**.

Safer Sac - Better Public Transit & Safer Streets



[SaferSacStreets](#) is advocating for better public transportation and safer streets by getting a citizen-led initiative on the 2026 ballot that would increase the sales tax by half a cent to raise funds.

Half the funds raised would go to improving public transportation and half would go to improving cycling and pedestrian infrastructure, particularly in sections of Sacramento that need it the most.

Great progress has been made in collecting signatures, but **SaferSacStreets still needs your help!** We need enough signatures by mid-June so that the measure will get onto the ballot in November and we're almost there. This is the last push, so if you haven't yet signed and you live in the City of Sacramento, now's the time!

America Bikes Act Introduced in Congress

In May, Democratic California Representative Mike Thompson and Republican Florida Representative Vern Buchanan introduced the bipartisan America Bikes Act (H.R. 9041) to improve rider safety, **expand biking infrastructure** and **support bicycle manufacturing in the United States**.

"Cycling is good for people and good for our planet. It just makes sense that we'd invest in expanding bike access and road safety so more Americans can benefit from cycling," said Thompson.

Oppose the BUILD America 250 Act



From America Walks:

Congress took a big step backward last month, advancing a transportation bill that pours more money into supporting big roads and dangerous vehicles at a time when pedestrian deaths remain incredibly high, and the cost of car ownership keeps going up. The BUILD America 250 Act would invest less funding into building streets that are safe for walking and connecting communities to affordable transportation options like walking, biking, and transit.
